		Ward Member – Margaret Maybury	I apologise to the committee for not being able to attend today. I believe emphasis on this application should be given to the historical nature of the listed building, park land and garden at Chilton Hall as this area is the only surviving manorial property within the immediate villages of Acton, Chilton, Great Waldingfield and Little Waldingfield as mentioned in David Burnett's book "Chilton the first three thousand years" (published by the Sudbury Museum Trust 2015).	

	Therefore no entrance onto the road from the proposed site should be allowed. Sufficient bunding and tree border should be used to shield the development from Chilton Hall, the parkland and garden.
	The B1115 is also extremely dangerous with its twisting nature and the amount of HGV vehicles using it from their depot at the old airfield. I have witnessed pedestrians being almost sucked under the wheels of HGVs as they have nowhere to shelter along a narrow footpath and also witnessed cyclists vying for road space from the large traffic as the large vehicles use the middle of the road to transverse the bends and camber of the B1115. I would urge the committee today to take these considerations into account."
