<u>Construction Management Plan – Carries out by Broham Forecourt</u> <u>Developments LTD</u>

Summary

- Works to take around 22 weeks, Mon. to Fri. 8am to 6pm and Sat. 8am to 1pm
- Local residents to be informed with regards proposed nature of works and working hours
- Parking to be within site curtilage parking on nearby public roads to be avoided
- Security and site lighting to avoid intrusion to residential properties, sensitive areas, the highway, and to limit light pollution
- Wheel Washing to be available on site
- Vehicles to be checked by gateman/banksman to ensure wheels are clean to prevent spread of mud and spoil onto the roads
- On call road sweeper available to clear any debris carried out onto roads
- Access to be via existing site entrance and exit to A143
- Traffic entering and leaving the site will be via a left turn only to prevent any potential queuing traffic
- Construction traffic to be routed via A14/A140/A1436 Local roads and Diss Town to be avoided
- Temporary hard standing and haul roads to be provided for construction vehicles in interest of avoiding mud and soil spillage onto public highway
- Majority of material components will be pre-fabricated with no need for on-site storage – no requirement for bulk storage of materials such as bricks, blocks, roof trusses or mortar silos etc.
- Temporary hoarding (2m high mesh panel fencing) to be erected around site perimeter
- Site to be drained in accordance with current guidance
- No foul water to be disposed during construction phase
- Waste to be removed from the site on a regular basis in rubbish skips
- Diesel oil required for on site heavy plant, machinery and generators to be stored on site in fully bounded tanks in compliance with Pollution Protection Guidelines
- Plant and machinery to be subject to regular checks to prevent possibility of ground contamination
- Full survey of road to be undertaken prior to commencement and any damage attributed to construction vehicles will be repaired to LHA requirements
- Programme of dust control to be implemented
