#### What do we stand for?

What drives us is a commitment to partnership and cooperation, exemplified by the make-up of our administration and the way we will work together with our communities, the voluntary sector, business, and our neighbouring councils to respond to the challenges that confront us and help build a sustainable future.

We will listen to and work with communities on the issues that matter most to them, giving them a say on their future. We will also support and empower them to deliver community-based solutions.

## 1. We will take the lead in responding to the challenge of climate change and protecting and enhancing our natural and historic environments

We recognise the threat climate change poses to the future of our communities and the impact it is having today. We live in a beautiful area, and we must protect and enhance our landscape and our wildlife habitats. Our role will be to bring groups together to develop new solutions, create an environment where these solutions can be put into practice, seek out funding and ensure our people have the new skills that will be needed.
