## Joint Scrutiny Committee Report

## 1. Joint Scrutiny Committee Meeting of 15 February 2017

A summary of key items follows - for full details of all the discussions please see the reports and the minutes.

**1.1 Neighbourhood Plans**: Continuing the review of the two Councils' support for the development of Neighbourhood Plans, the Committee heard from three communities - Lavenham (who had just completed a Neighbourhood Plan); Woolpit (who were in the process); and Copdock & Washbrook (who had decided not to go ahead with a Plan).

**1.2** There was an extremely interesting discussion with some wide-ranging questions including those on types of support needed, the difficulties in getting a Neighbourhood Plan underway, the issues particular to small parishes, the costs and the time taken.

**1.3** It was very valuable to hear such detailed contributions from community representatives and it was agreed that a Task & Finish Group be set up to consider the evidence and report recommendations back to the Committee.

**1.4 Community Engagement:** Continuing this review, the Committee heard from two service groups - Tenancy Services, who had been running engagement exercises for some time, about their approach to engagement; and Open for Business, whose approach was emerging.

**1.5** Members asked questions of the two service areas and particularly focussed on what could be used to assess success and how good learning was shared across the organisation.

## 2. Joint Scrutiny Committee Meeting of 19 April 2017

**2.1 Community Engagement:** Following on from the last meeting, the Committee were due to hear from service users of the two previously mentioned Council services – tenants and a local business – on their engagement experiences with the Councils.

**2.2 Disabled Adaptations to Properties:** Members asked for a presentation from officers to understand what the Councils could do to make any impact on the issues surrounding the delayed transfer of care – and specifically whether any issues surrounding disabled adaptations needed to be reviewed.

**2.3 Task & Finish Group report on support for Neighbourhood Plans:** After considering the evidence from the last Committee meeting, and having researched what other councils offered (both locally and nationally) Members put forward five

recommendations. These were relating to in-house officer support, developing a memorandum of understanding with community groups, adding information to the Councils' website, providing member training and reviewing support for small parishes.
