ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

The following conditions in Annex 1 are mandatory under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003:

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied:
 - (a) At any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) At any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended
2. Every sale or supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
4. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the film classification.
5. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
8. (a) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(b) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- i. a holographic mark, or
- ii. an ultraviolet feature

9. The responsible person must ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

10. The relevant person (the holder of the premises licence, the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence, or any member or officer of a club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question) shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of this condition “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979, “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where - (i) **P** is the permitted price, (ii) **D** is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

[“value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994]

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The following conditions in Annex 2 are carried across to the new premises licence from the existing conditions and restrictions contained within and by virtue of existing authorisations, and enactments as specified by the Secretary of State, and as required by Schedule 8(6) of the Licensing Act 2003:

1. The playing of recorded music is restricted to music and singing provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound.
2. By virtue of the Children’s Certificate granted under section 168A of the Licensing Act 1964, operational between the hours of 12 noon to 2.15pm and 6.45pm to 9.00pm on Mondays to Saturdays and 12 noon to 3.00pm and 7.00pm to 9.00pm on Sundays:

No person under 14 shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

1. He/she is the child of the holder of the premises licence
2. He/she resides in the premises, but is not employed there
3. He/she is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress
4. The bar is in premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the premises licence is ancillary
5. He/she is in the Lounge or Dining Area of the premises
6. Meals and non-alcoholic beverages are available for sale for consumption in the Lounge and Dining Area
7. He/she is in the company of a person aged 18 or over
8. He/she is there:
 - (i) prior to 9.00pm or;

(ii) between 9.00pm and 9.30pm where he/she or the said person is consuming a meal purchased before 9.00pm

2(a) Whilst the above (2) is in force:

- All gaming machines in the area must be switched off or covered.
- All under 14 year olds to be supervised by adults.
- No meals to be consumed at the bar by children.
- There must be adequate seating away from the bar.

3. Alcohol should not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Years Eve 10.00am to 11.00pm.
- b. On Sundays other than Christmas Day or New Years Eve 12 noon to 10.30pm.
- c. On Good Friday 12 noon to 10.30pm.
- d. On Christmas Day 12 noon to 3 pm and 7pm to 10.30pm.
- e. On New Years Eve except on a Sunday 10.00am to 11.00pm.
- f. On New Years Eve on a Sunday 12 noon to 10.30pm.
- g. On New Years Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on the 31 December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a. During the first 20 minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b. During the first 20 minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c. During the first 30 minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- d. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- e. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises or be despatched by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- f. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- g. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- h. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bone fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- i. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the Licence (personal Licence) or the consumption of alcohol so supplied if the alcohol is supplied at the expense of there employer or the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

4. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:

- a) With or for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal.
- b) For the consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation.
- c) To a canteen or mess.
